CopperPlus Stands the Test of Time at Farmers Market.



The Farmers Market in downtown Reading, PA, constructed in 1970, is testament to the beauty, warmth, durability and strength of CopperPlus – the copper clad stainless steel material that tops the building. CopperPlus is a multimetal of solid copper metallurgically bonded to both sides of a stainless steel substrate that not only looks like solid copper, but outperforms it, and offers significant cost savings. Fully annealed, CopperPlus cuts and forms like ordinary sheet metals, solders as easily as solid copper, and is weldable.

Textured CopperPlus panels precut to 13 feet by 20 inches were specified by architect Wilbur Latshaw for the Farmers Market's distinctive mansard roof. Because CopperPlus is lighter than copper, installation was easy despite the large-size panels. The embossed stucco pattern and low thermal expansion of CopperPlus eliminates "oil canning" that is common in most sheet metals. Like solid copper, CopperPlus weathers uniformly to a soft green patina, which is enhanced by the roof's embossed surface.

CopperPlus is growing in popularity and has been specified by architects and designers for fascia, wall panels, roofing, flashing, rain drainage, and general sheet metal work in a wide range of institutional, commercial, and residential buildings.
